Earl Madison is Director, SATCOM & DoD Space on the Space and Missile Defense Programs Team, Lockheed Martin Government Affairs - Washington. He serves as the interface between Lockheed Martin's space-related lines of business and Washington based customers for SATCOM programs and terminal/systems integration, Space Fence, and other programs. Earl works to align customer and corporate needs, establish priorities, and develop and execute marketing strategies for supported programs. He previously supported the GPS-IIR and SBIRS programs. Earl frequently contributes to policy and space architecture development through participation in meetings with Government leaders, industry associations, architecture studies, and exercises such as the Schriever, Office of Net Assessment, and other wargames. He was presented the Lockheed Martin Washington Award in 2008 and 2012 and the Lockheed Martin Eagle Award in 2014. He currently holds a TS/SCI security clearance.

Earl is an active participant in several industry and professional associations and has held a variety of leadership positions to include Chair of the Space Enterprise Council, Chair of the AIA National Security Space Committee, Co-Lead of the SIA Government Working Group, and Board of Directors member for the Army Space Professionals Association and the Federation of Galaxy Explorers. He is an AIAA Associate Fellow.

Prior to joining Lockheed Martin, Earl completed a career in the United States Army that spanned over 28 years and retired as a colonel. He served in a series of Signal Corps, Operations Research, and Space Operations positions of increasing responsibility culminating in his final assignment as the Chief of Staff of the National Security Space Architect where he advised the Director and provided oversight of space mission architecture developments, policy formulation, space budget assessments, and organizational administration. His many assignments include service in three combat infantry divisions, including command of the 10th Signal Battalion in the 10th Mountain Division (Light Infantry); two tours on the Joint Staff; service as a military advisor in El Salvador; and assignment as an instructor at the Army Logistics Management College.

Earl earned a M.S. in Operations Research Engineering from the Naval Postgraduate School and a B.S. from the United States Military Academy. He is a graduate of the Air War College, the Armed Forces Staff College, the Command and General Staff College, and the Canadian Advanced Logistics Officer Course. His military awards and decorations include the Defense Superior Service Medal, the Legion of Merit, and the Defense Meritorious Service Medal.
